

## US California Proposes Three Priority Products Under Safer Consumer Products(SCP) Regulations

On March 13, 2014, California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) published the proposed list of three product-chemical combinations as required by the SCP regulations.

When your product is on the final Priority Products list, the responsible entities must submit a Priority Product notification to DTSC within 60 days after the effective date of the regulation, and perform an Alternative Analysis.

This draft is scheduled to go through formal rulemaking process including a 45-days public notice and comment period.

Below is the information of proposed Priority Products:
